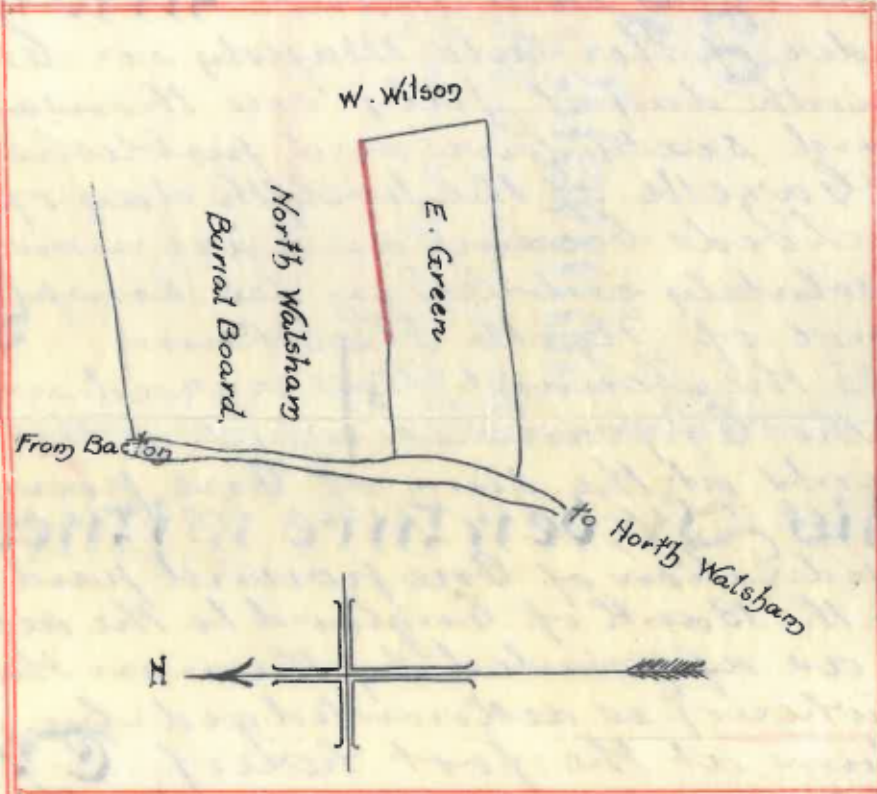

one thousand nine hundred and two Between The Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England (Lords of the Manor of North Walsham and hereinafter called the Lords) of the one part and Edward Green of North Walsham in Norfolk Farmer (hereinafter called the Tenant) of the other part ~~Whereas~~ on the twenty second day of August one thousand eight hundred and seventy six the Tenant was admitted on Surrender of William Cooper Esq (inter alia) the bank ditch and premises hereinafter particularly described and expressed to be hereby conveyed To hold the same to him the Tenant his heirs and assigns according to the custom of the said Manor ~~And whereas~~ by an Order of Her late Majesty in Council dated the ninth day of July one thousand eight hundred and sixty four and published in the London Gazette of the twelfth day of the same month the Lords became and are now seized of and absolutely entitled in fee simple to the said Manor of North Walsham ~~And whereas~~ the Tenant has agreed with the Lords for the Emfranchisement of the said hereditaments at the sum of One pound ~~And~~ ~~his~~ ~~Indenture~~ ~~Witnesses~~ that in consideration of One pound paid by the Tenant into the Bank of England to the account of the Lords as appointed by them in that behalf the receipt whereof is acknowledged by a memorandum at the foot hereof ~~They~~ The Lords ~~Do~~ hereby grant unto the Tenant ~~That~~ Ditch and Fence One hundred and eighty nine feet long and eight feet wide situate in North Walsham aforesaid bounded towards the North by land belonging to the North Walsham Cemetery towards the East by land of William Wilson and towards the South and West by the residue of the hereditaments to which the Tenant was admitted on the said twenty second day of August one





thousand eight hundred and seventy six
 and retained by him as the same Ditch
 and Fence are more particularly delineated
 on the plan drawn on these presents and
 therein coloured red **Together** with all the
 rights reserved by section twenty three of the
 Copyhold Act one thousand eight hundred
 and ninety four **To hold** the same unto and to
 the use of the Tenant his heirs and assigns
 discharged from the Copyhold tenure thereof and from
 incidents whatsoever of copyhold or customary
 tenure **And** the

 with the Tenant
 his heirs and
 assigns That
 they the Lords
 have not done
 anything whereby
 or by reason or
 means whereof
 any part of the
 hereditaments
 hereby granted
 is in anywise
 incumbered **And**

 Common Seal to be hereunto affixed and the
 Tenant has hereunto set his hand and seal the day
 and year first above written
