Chief Constable Paul Sanford is urging Norfolk residents to use the Street Safe online tool to report areas where they feel unsafe in the county.

The Street Safe tool enables anyone to anonymously flag public places and mark on a map the areas where they feel unsafe while remaining anonymous, and while anyone can use it, women and girls are particularly being encouraged to use the online platform.

Launched by the Home Office and Police Digital Service, the tool, which is being piloted across England and Wales until the end of November can be accessed by clicking on: www.police.uk/streetsafe

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR AREA?

North Walsham Safer Neighbourhood Team have continued to work on the policing priorities set the by the SNAP panel. High visibility patrols continue to be undertaken in and around the area of Saddlers Woods, North Walsham to deter ASB and the use of off-road bikes using the area, and also at The Memorial Park, North Walsham in order to combat youths congregating and using drugs.

The team have also assisted other areas with Policing festivals/ events and the execution of warrants. Most of the warrants executed were under the misuse of drugs act with a successful outcome. The team also have a strong working relationship with the operational partnership team (OPT) and have assisted them by conducting joint visits to vulnerable persons in town and local villages. They also work with the OPT on issues with ASB and monitoring youths or areas of concern including regular visits to the Schools.

The team are still carrying out engagement surgeries at Supermarkets, details of which can be found on our Facebook and Twitter page.

Now that the nights are drawing in please make sure that out buildings, garages etc are all locked up and security lights/ alarms are all working correctly.

CRIME UPDATES (1st to 30th September)

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	1	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary business and community	0	A person commits theft in a building or structure that is not lived in.
Burglary residential	1	Entry and theft in a building or a structure that is lived in.
Criminal Damage	13	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	21	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	1	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	11	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
